- Heritage: Le Château Oléron's citadel and the famous Fort Boyard teach you about conflicts during the era and you will be able to explore the oldest active lighthouse in Chassiron,
- The Land and its food: the oysters of Marennes Oléron, farmed mussels that form part of the traditional Charentais dish 'églade' and "la bière des Naufrageurs" (ship wrecker's beer) which comes in 18 flavours,
- Visits and outings: the Museum of the Île d'Oléron, you can also visit the Hermione ship and the Corderie Royale at Rochefort or meet the 1 600 animals in La Palmyre 200
