The Valley of the Châteaux

Discover the **most beautiful châteaux**, by yourself or with a guide who will bring all these locations to life: Beynac, Castelnaud, Les Milandes, Fénélon, Feyrac or Marqueyssac, whose picturesque, **romantic gardens** overlook the Dordogne. Magnificent locations rich in history...

A cuisine of renown

Try the perennial favourites: the "**foie gras**", **truffles**, Bergerac wines (including the famous "**Monbazillac**"), very flavourful varieties of strawberry like the "**gariguettes**", walnuts and walnut wine, porcini mushrooms... Not to mention sturgeon, beer, chestnut liqueur, sweets and jams, cheese, honey and more. The menu is rich and varied!

Authentic villages

Discover **Sarlat-la-Canéda**, a medieval town rich in history. Explore some "**Plus Beaux Villages de France**" (The Most Beautiful Villages in France): Belvès and its seven bell towers, Beynac and its château, Limeuil and the remains of its ramparts... Next to the Lot department, **Rocamadour** is a "Holy City" full of charm, where houses and chapels jostle for space at the foot of the château.

Our other favourites

- **Nature and countryside:** Les Causses du Quercy regional natural park boasts an exceptional geological heritage, with rivers suitable for "gabarres" flat-bottomed boats and canoes,
- **The open air:** swimming, fishing, hiking, introduction to nature on outdoor activity centres: Rouffiac, the large pond of Jemaye and more,
- **Visits and outings:** Beynac Archaeological Park, Le Bournat Park which illustrates the daily life of farmers at the beginning of the 20th century...
